

**CORRECTION CODE**

Here are the **abbreviations** and **symbols** that I use to **check writing compositions**, along with what the abbreviations stand for and their explanations:

<b>CONJ</b>	This means you used the wrong <b>conjunction</b> . E.g. <u>Like</u> I said before... <b>CONJ</b>
<b>GR</b>	This mistake relates to <b>grammatical rules</b> . E.g. She <u>don't</u> like butter. <b>GR</b>
<b>PREP</b>	This shortening stands for <b>“preposition”</b> and you should have used another one. E.g. We explored around the area <u>for</u> car. <b>PREP</b>
<b>PUNC</b>	This stands for <b>“punctuation”</b> and it means either the punctuation mark is missing or wrong. E.g. I like going riding horse? <b>PUNC</b>
<b>SP</b>	It means you made a <b>spelling</b> mistake. E.g. They felt <u>embarrased</u> about what they had done. <b>SP</b>
<b>VT</b>	This stands for <b>“verb tense”</b> , and it may mean that you used present instead of past, or present instead of “going to”, etc. E.g. I <u>go</u> to church with Lucy last Sunday. <b>VT</b>
<b>WO</b>	It stands for <b>“word order”</b> , so you should have reversed the position of the sentence components. E.g. My <u>Teddy bear cute</u> travelled in the back <u>three times more</u> <b>WO</b> <b>WO</b>
<b>WW</b>	By this we mean <b>“wrong word”</b> . E.g. The <u>macets</u> are on the balcony. <b>WW</b>
<b>—</b>	This symbol means that <b>word</b> should be <b>ruled out</b> . E.g. Doris <u>she</u> purchased an amazing duplex in Boston.
<b>/</b>	This means a <b>word</b> is <b>missing</b> in that gap. E.g. I don't know what / do.
<b>?</b>	This means the <b>word</b> or <b>passage</b> is <b>unintelligible</b> or <b>nonsensical</b> . E.g. <u>Max went for below in a beach an go the first</u> <b>?</b>
<b>!</b>	This is a rewarding punctuation mark which means <b>“well done!”</b> . E.g. <u>I would appreciate it if you could be so kind as to give me a lift.</u> <b>!</b>
